School Street - Keeping Our Tamariki Safe

To help keep our tamariki and whānau safe at the start and end of the school day, our school operates a School Street.

A School Street is a section of road outside the school that is temporarily closed to through-traffic during busy times. This creates a safer, calmer space for children to walk and arrive at school safely.

Operating times:

Morning: 8:30 - 9:15am

Afternoon: 2:30 - 3:15pm

Local residents will still be able to access their homes, and staff will be present to support everyone during these times.

Thank you for working with us to prioritise safety, wellbeing, and care for our tamariki.

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Wellbeing Mentor

Kia ora whānau,

We are pleased to share that Rānui School now has a Wellbeing Mentor supporting our students.

The role of the Wellbeing Mentor is to provide a safe, caring space for children to talk about their feelings, worries, friendships, and everyday challenges that can affect learning and Wellbeing.

Students may spend time with the Wellbeing Mentor to:

- talk through big or confusing feelings
- learn simple calming and coping strategies
- feel heard, supported, and reassured

This support is an added layer of pastoral care to help children feel settled, confident, and ready to learn.

We value working alongside families and whānau in caring for the whole child – heart, mind, and wellbeing.

School finishes at 3pm and we ask that all children are collected promptly (please see "before and after school supervision" in our Policies and Procedures on the school website).

When tamariki are picked up late, it can cause them to feel unsettled or unsure, and it also impacts staff who are often preparing for the next day's learning or need to leave to pick their own tamariki up. We completely understand that emergencies or unexpected delays can happen from time to time — if you are running late, please just give the office a quick call.
