Thank you to our whānau and community for the positive support you have shown with the School Street initiative. Your cooperation helps ensure our tamariki can arrive at and leave school safely.


During School Street times, the road near the school gate is restricted to reduce traffic and create a safer space for students walking, biking, and arriving at kura.
