Roadside

A friendly reminder to all whānau to please have tamariki exit vehicles on the footpath side whenever possible, rather than stepping out onto the road.

The few extra seconds it takes can make a big difference in keeping our children safe, especially during busy drop-off and pick-up times. Exiting on the footpath side helps reduce the risk of tamariki stepping into traffic or between moving vehicles.



Hats

Please ensure your tamaiti brings a hat to school each day (Even in Winter). With the strength of our sun, this is an important part of keeping our tamariki safe and building lifelong sun-safe habits.

Healthy Lunch Boxes

At Rānui School, we encourage healthy lunchboxes that help our tamariki stay energised, focused, and ready for learning throughout the day. Nutritious food supports concentration, wellbeing, behaviour, and active participation both in the classroom and on the playground.

We ask whānau to help avoid sending excessive junk food, lollies, energy drinks, and large amounts of sugary snacks in lunchboxes. Simple, healthy options such as fruit, sandwiches, crackers, yoghurt, leftovers, and water are great choices for growing bodies and minds.



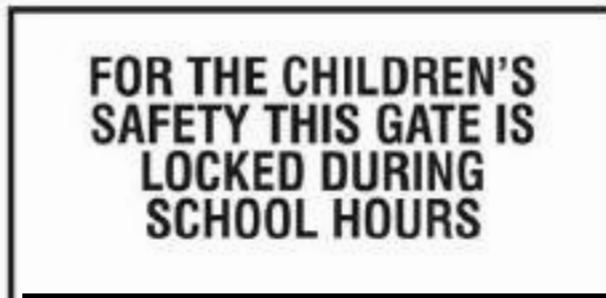
