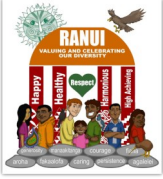

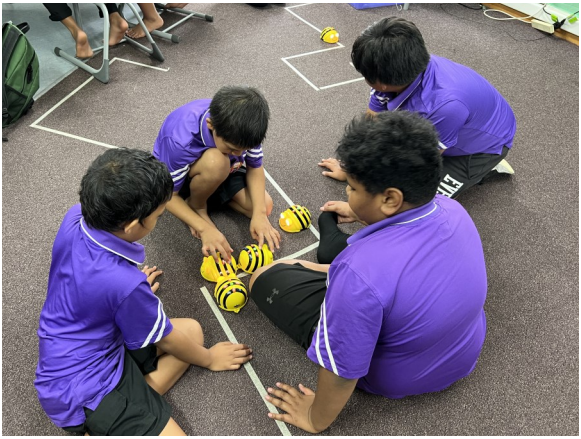

ROPETA ATAPANA SAITOFIGA

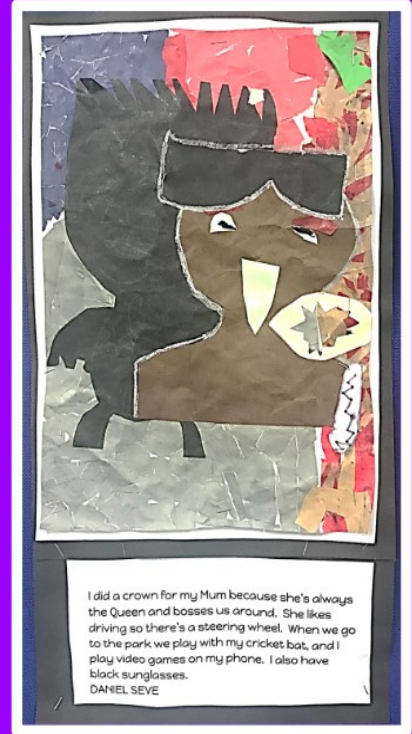


My mum is standing behind me because she is nice and she lets me sleep with my friends. She is wearing a crown.

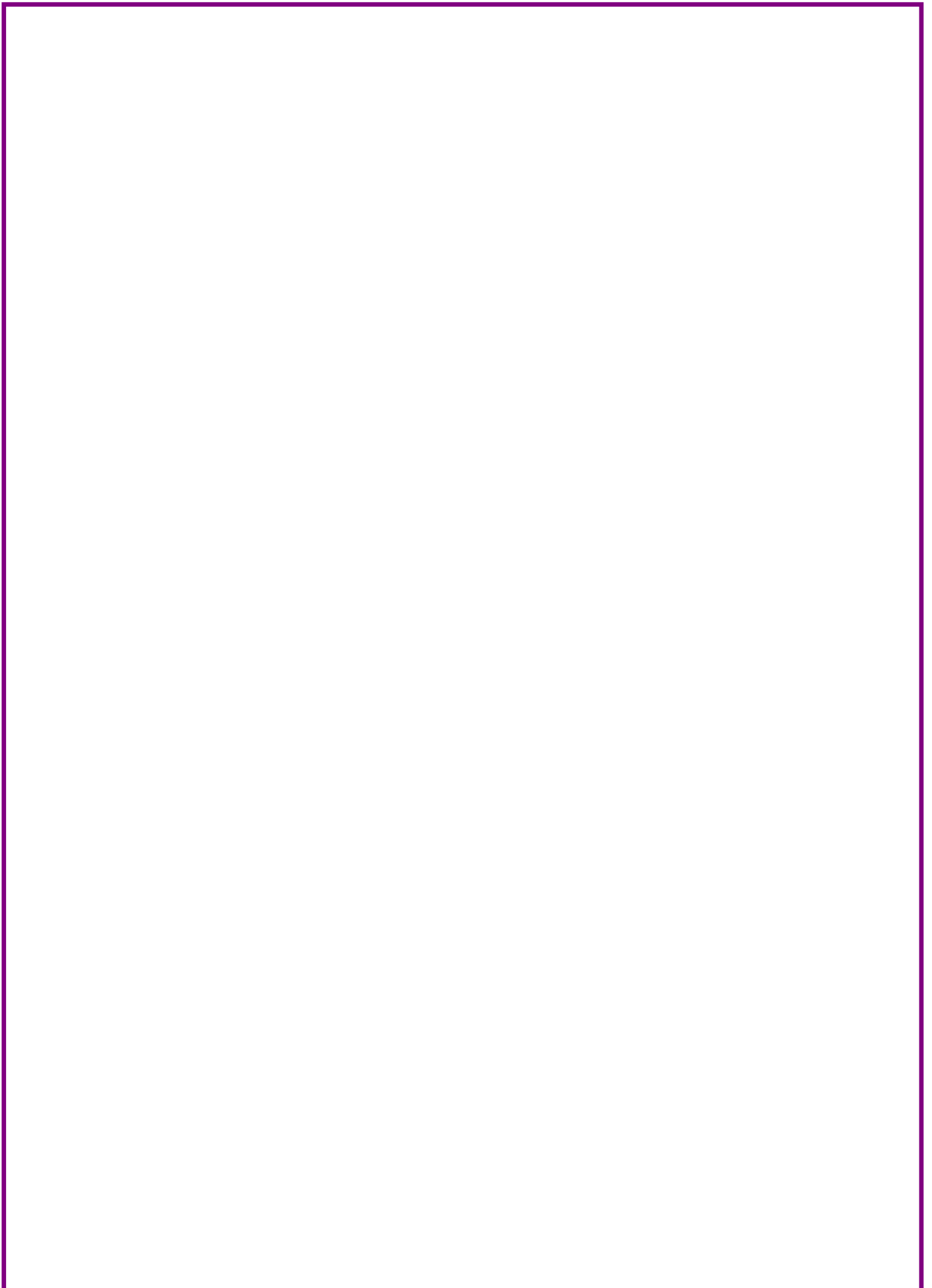


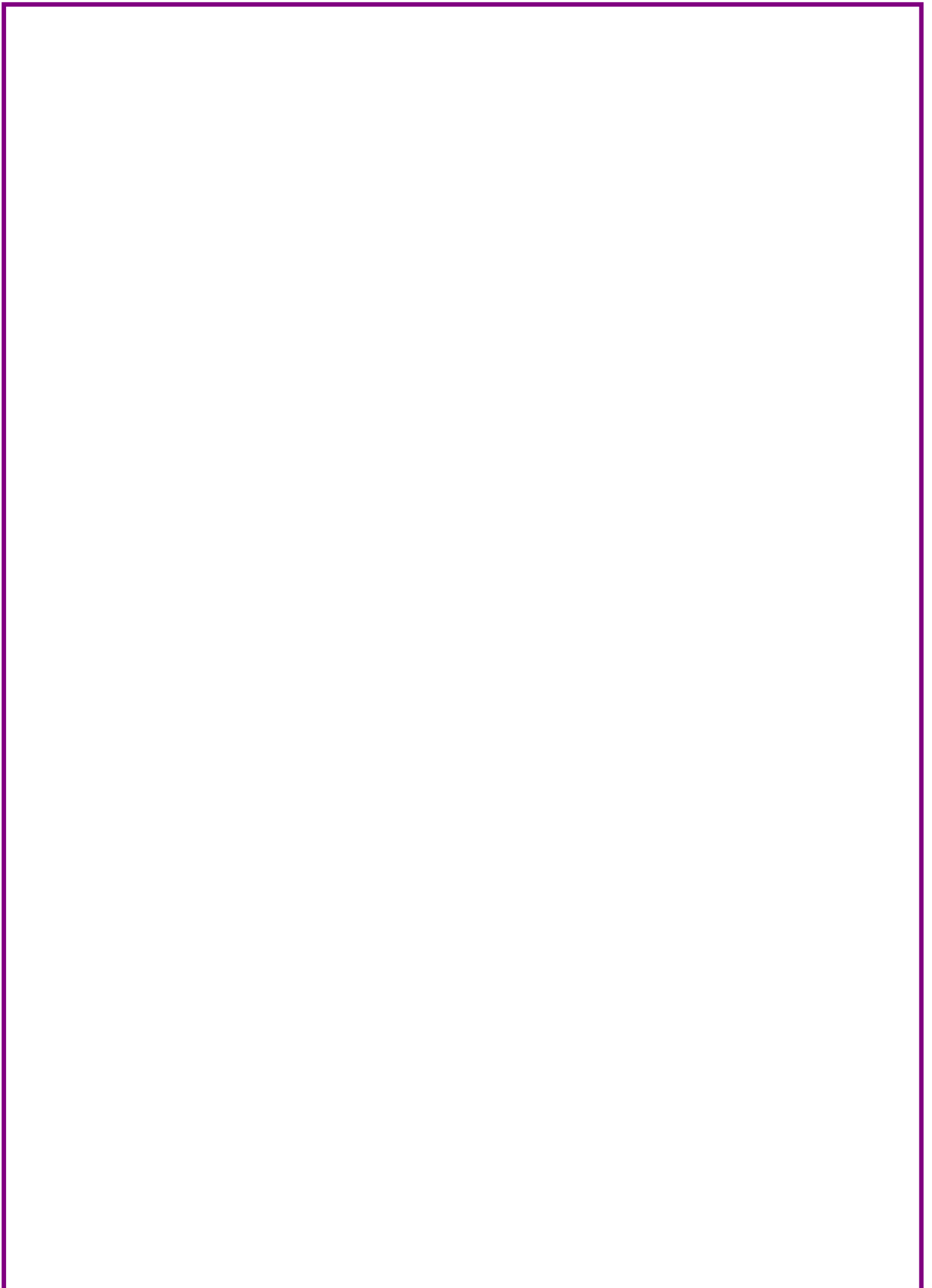
