On Wednesday 7th of February our Samoan Bilingual Unit was opened and blessed by Pastor Semau. The name of the unit Toloa A'oa'oina is inspired by our families and comes from the alagaupu

"E lele le Toloa, ae ma'au i le vai"

The Pacific grey duck soars away, though always returns to the water.

From this is the concept that regardless of where a person of Samoan descent may travel to in the world, they are always intrinsically connected to their family, culture and heritage. The way to "return" home is always available to them.

Our vision is to be that pathway, to immerse our children in the Samoan language and culture so they can move swiftly in different world settings but have the confidence to know, sustain and connect to their heritage - their way home.

We are honoured and privileged to be able to offer this education pathway in our community and to our next generation of toloa.


