On the Whanau Fun Night a children’s scooter was left behind, if this scooter is yours, please ask Lesley and Tania in the office about it.



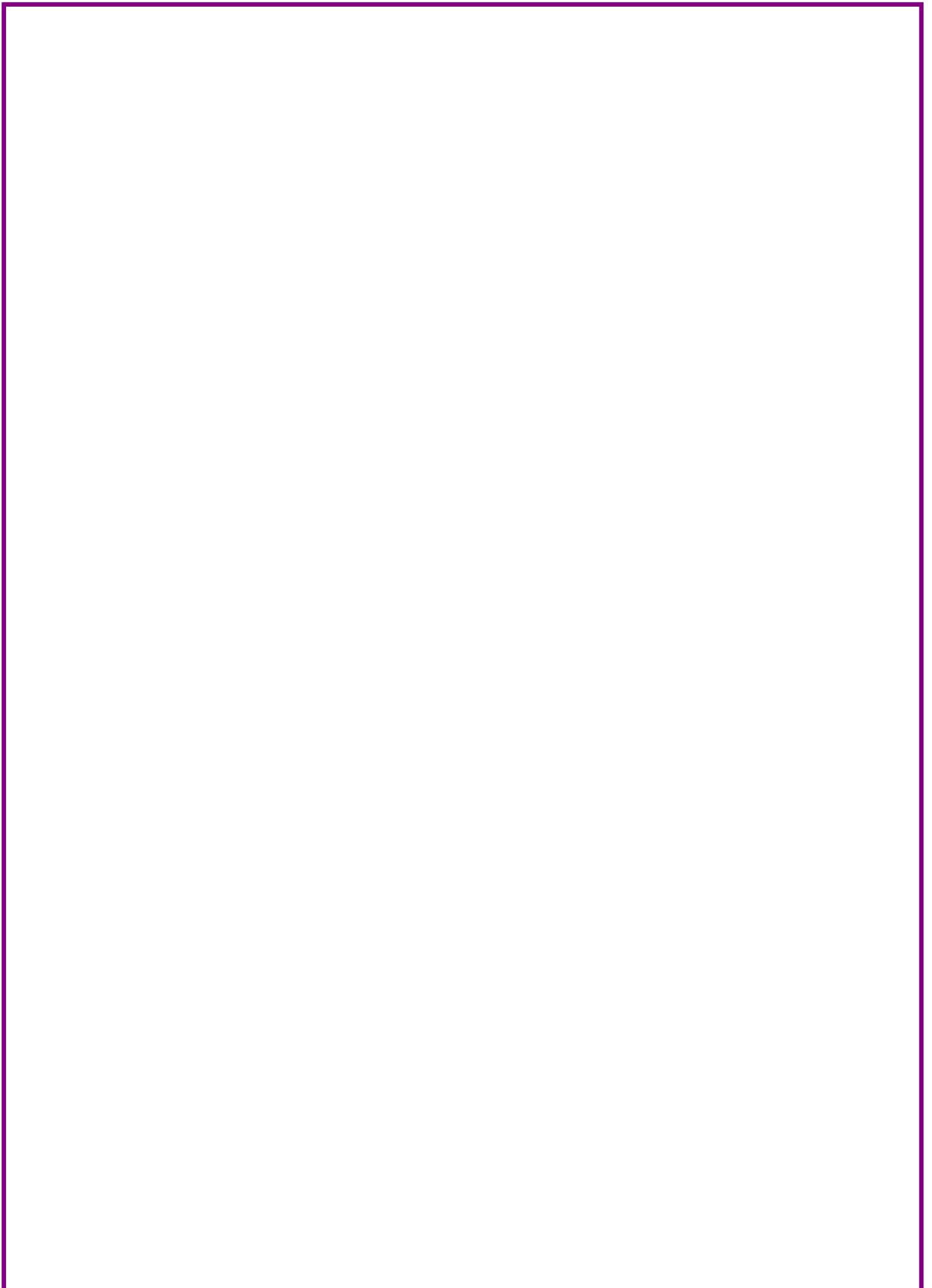

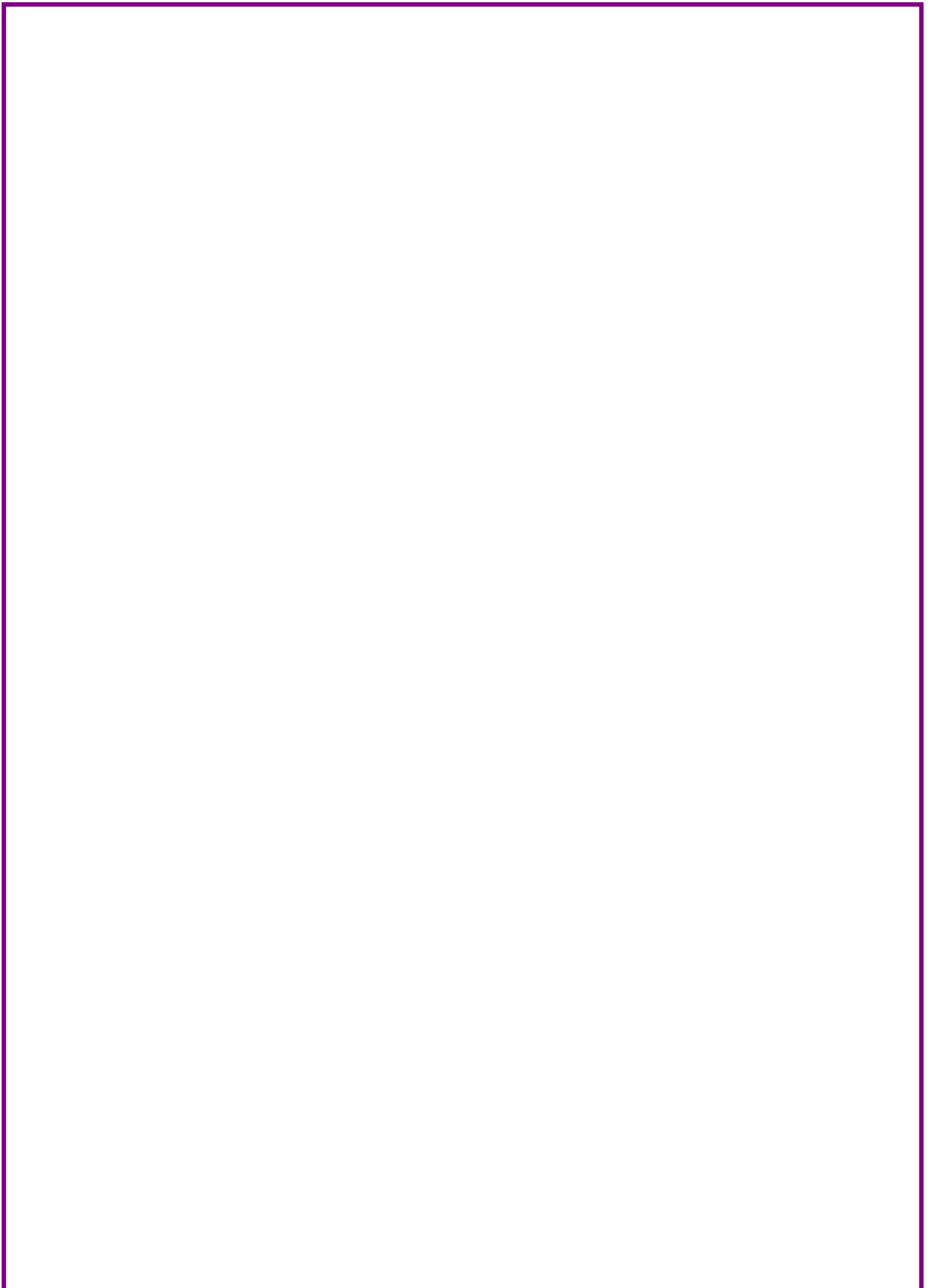
