GirlGuiding NZ is part of the international movement to empower young girls to be confident, adventurous women. At weekly unit meetings of 1 to 2 hours (depending on age), girls and leaders come together to do a wide range of activities to explore our world, our community, the outdoors and our wider guiding family. Optional weekend events and camps allow the girls to expand their experiences and opportunities.

I'm a volunteer leader for the Waitakere Pippins & Brownies unit that meets on Thursdays for girls aged 5 to 9 in Waitakere Township - about 15 minutes from Ranui opposite Waitakere Primary School. Emma (TWK 2 - my daughter) attends this unit. We also have a Guide unit for girls aged 9 to 12 on Thursday evenings.

In Henderson, there is a Brownies unit (for girls aged 7 to 9) and a Rangers unit (girls aged 12 to 17) at our hall in Fairdene Reserve.

We also have units in Hobsonville, Te Atatu, Glen Eden and across Auckland.

Girls are welcome to come and visit to learn more about Girl Guiding and decide if it is something they would like to do. If you sign up online, you will be matched to a unit 'waitlist' and then invited to come for a visit.






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My Favorite Room In My House
