Time 1

There will be 7 places available

- Enrolment applications Close: Wednesday 19th June 3pm
- Ballot Date: Wednesday 26th June

Time 2 (For 2025)

There will be 7 places available

- Enrolment applications Close: Tuesday 15th October 3pm
- Ballot Date: Wednesday 23rd October

Lunchtime Club








MATARIKI DISCO
