Right next to Rānui Primary School is the beautiful Rānui Kindergarten, where a lot of our children have graduated from. Kindergarten helps prepare children for primary school by helping them develop social skills, verbal communication, independence, responsibility and helps foster pre-literacy skills through a play-based curriculum. When you get the form please send back to school before the end of term.














